

He was diagnosed with Cancer. The last remedy was to amputee his hand. Hence his left hand was amputated in Wadia Hospital. Now he is without his left hand and it is difficult to fix an artificial hand.



He is from a very poor family. His father Shrikant works as a watchman and mother Vaishali goes to a readymade garment loom to cut the threads of the garments. He has two sisters. Seeing the pitiful condition of the family Sr. Seema Thomas together with the community encouraged him and extended financial assistance for his education. He has completed his school education and he has taken admission in Junior college (11<sup>th</sup> class). He is ambitious and wants to complete his higher studies to secure a better future.

The Sisters from Premal Jyoti, Varanasi are involved in PRISON MINISTRY in collaboration with the Diocese of Varanasi and visit the inmates of Central Jail of Varanasi. There are about 1600 young, middle aged and old men living inside the prison. On 15<sup>th</sup> August 2016, India celebrated 70<sup>th</sup> Independence Day. And at this juncture with special permission, Sr. Meena Carvalho along with the Diocesan Priest took this initiative to organize a cultural program in the jail for our brothers who are away from their families and society. Children from different schools performed colourful programs to lift the inmates' spirit. It was a moving moment to be in and interact with them.

Every Saturday we visit the District Jail of Varanasi. There are 91 women and 5 children staying along with their mothers. As we interact with them and listen to their stories we learn that some are falsely accused with dowry death, harassment, robbery, murder and enmity in the family and with neighbours. Others are involved in criminal activities due to hindered circumstances and emotional imbalances. Some of them narrated their stories revealing that they were falsely accused. We give listening ear to many heart-breaking stories and pray in our heart that the God of mercy pour His blessing upon them and all of us who are involved directly and indirectly may hear the cries of the thousands innocent prisoners rejected by their families and society.

## **Cancer Detection Camp**

On 10<sup>th</sup> of August 2016 to mark the celebration of the Platinum Jubilee Year of the Congregation, the Sisters of Shraddha Vihar Hospital organised a free Cancer Detection Camp for 100 women who were above 40 years. Today the cost of treatment has become unaffordable for the poor and needy. We organized this camp for poor women. A team of 15 doctors and staff from Tata Hospital conducted the camp in collaboration with the Helpers of Mary. Different check-ups were carried out like; General check-up, ENT, hypertensive check-up, diabetic, and the internal check-up such as breast examination and pap smear and blood tests. Many women from surrounding slums, colonies of St. Blaise Parish, inmates of Jivan Asha and Sisters of Shraddha Vihar benefited from this camp. We express our sincere gratitude to Mrs. Minal and the team for giving their precious time and helping hand to take care of our people.

## **Empowering Women To Bring Change**



Young women encounter challenges every day. Apart from sharing their communities' struggles over limited resources like water, land or jobs, many systematically face discrimination simply by virtue of being female. This includes physical and sexual violence, being kept out of school, lack of access to property and other rights etc. To Empower Women to bring a change Sr. Nisha organized a two days Capacity Building Workshop for the Schedule Caste (SC) and Schedule Tribes (ST) women of the surrounding slum. She contacted the Regional Education Officer, Mrs. Vandana Shreevastav and arranged a Training Programme which was held on 16th and 17th August 2016. It covered topics on Leadership, Government Schemes, Health and Hygiene, Banking System and Facilities, Right to Information, Rights of SC/ST and Entrepreneurship. The first batch of 40 women that attended the program were enriched with this input sessions and gained insights on various relevant issues and built confidence to deal with problems in more appropriate way. Women who attended the program were given an incentive of Rs. 200/-.


This same workshop will be conducted in September, October & November 2016), for SC/ST and minority women living in the slums.

## **Act of Compassion**

In November 2010 Mr. Surender, 44 years of age had gone to his relative's house for a function. On his way home late at night he was on his bicycle crossing the railway line, he fell on the tracks and was unconscious. To his bad luck no one was around. Around midnight a train passed through that crossing and ran over Surender's legs. When he came to his senses he was shocked to see



both his legs cut from his body and lying in a pool of blood. He cried loudly, people heard his cry and carried him to the hospital. After two months he returned home without limbs. He was at the mercy of others. Sisters of Premal Jyoti while visiting came across Mr. Surender sitting alone in a small house in despair.

Sr. Meena took the initiative to take Surender to 'Bhagwan Mahaveer Viklang Sahayata Samiti' Varansi to get artificial legs. On 1st March 2016, he received his artificial legs free of cost and also a bicycle from Prime Minister's Fund and came back home riding the bicycle. A great number of people gathered to see him with his new legs and bicycle. After 5 years he began to move out of his house and was thrilled to get back to normal life. The joy in his eyes gave a new meaning to my acts of love and compassion. I began to ask, What does love look like? To me it has hands to help others. It has feet to hasten to assist the weak, poor and needy. It has eyes to see misery and wants of others. It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows. That is what love looks like.

The torrential rain in Uttar Pradesh in the last few days of August 2016 has caused havoc disrupting the normal life of people. Many rivers across the State were overflowing and leading to floods in the low lying areas. Varanasi the Holy City for our Hindu brethren was one of the most affected areas. Water level of the river Ganga had increased and the houses and belongings of the people staying in the vicinity were underwater. Thousands of people have lost their belongings.

The Society of the Helpers of Mary having our two centres in Varanasi had plunged out to carry on the immediate relief work for those affected by flood. The sisters of both communities; Premal Jyoti and Sneha Deep along with the Aspirants rendered help and support in collaboration with Diocese - Vishwa Jyoti Communication Centre. We visited Paigambar, Khidki, Nakkhi Ghat, Rajghat and Nagwa and distributed essential things to the affected families. Many houses were submerged. We went by boat and surveyed situation. Many families were taking shelter on the roof of the houses. We continue our efforts in helping them in this most tragic moment of their lives.
